

True and False Questions

If any part of the statement is wrong, the answer is false.

Most true/false tests contain more true answers than false answers. When in doubt, guess true.

Look for cue words used in **FALSE** questions. Words such as:

| | | | | | |
|-------|--------|---------|-------|---------|-----|
| Never | Always | Not | Best | Worst | All |
| Only | First | Totatly | Every | Exactly | |

Look for cue words in **TRUE** questions. Words such as:

| | | | | | |
|--------------|------|------------|-----------|---------|----------|
| Occasionally | Good | More | Sometimes | Equally | Probably |
| Usually | Less | Seldom | Many | May | Mainly |
| Fewer | Most | Frequently | Often | Might | Some |

Assume that the question is true and then look for absolute words to make it false.

Circle key words in difficult questions. This will force you to focus on the central point.
